Northshore Shuttles offers service year-round, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., along the entire Trail. Based in Duluth (southern end of the Trail). Reservations are required.

Rate is \$5.00 per person plus \$2.50 per mile. Red Bird operates year-round Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. for scheduled pick-ups with two days of notice. Same-day pick-up is possible, but not guaranteed. Service on Saturday is available May-October with three days of notice during the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. This is a Two Harbors-based transportation service and provides service to SHT trailheads between Martin Road Trailhead and Castle Danger Road Trailhead. Pick-ups or drop-offs are available outside this area for an additional fee of \$1/mile as availability allows. Pets are welcome with an additional \$15 fee. Pets must be leashed and under control in the vehicle.

The shuttle service's base camp is at [Points Unknown](#) in Hovland close to the northern terminus up the Arrowhead Trail. Camping, showers, secure parking, and other pre- and post-trip services available.
